



## **Adjunct Faculty needed for the faculty pool for the MA in Transformational Urban Leadership (MATUL)**

The MATUL program is an action – reflection degree in theology, movement leadership, social entrepreneurship and community development. The program is a global online series of conversations with leaders among the poor and in cities globally. It's a unique program at the cutting edge of global education. **Location of delivery:** Online, can be delivered faculty from anywhere in the world.

**Job Description:** The different positions below involve online course upgrading and delivery of one course to (1) American students who are living for two years in slums of cities globally (2) national leaders living/working with impoverished urban communities (3) US Students working with marginalized US urban communities. These may be in the 14 week Spring semester (Jan-April) or Summer (May-July) or Fall (Sept – Dec)

### **Specializations**

#### **TUL 670: Qualitative Urban Research Methods**

Students in this course design qualitative/participatory research projects related to significant issues on behalf of an urban movement or community organization.

#### **TUL 640: Entrepreneurial & Organizational Leadership**

This course introduces the concepts and skills of entrepreneurial and organizational leadership required to initiate new movement structures among the urban poor. [More Info.](#)

#### **TUL 500: Visions for the Ideal City**

This course relates the biblical motif of the Kingdom of God to issues of leadership development in resource-poor urban communities. [More Info.](#)

#### **TUL 520: Urban Spirituality**

An in-depth examination of spiritual foundations for living and thriving in the slums in the slum context, this course emphasizes the Cross as it impacts trauma, pain, sin and explores nurturing of cross-cultural workers living among the urban poor, the spirituality of the churches of the poor, and the practical application of spiritual disciplines. ## Responsibilities (with approximate time, 7-10 hrs. per week x 14 weeks)

- Teach online using the WCIU online environment (training available).
- Edit, improve, update course materials, prepare video clips or Power Points (2-5 hrs per week)
- Utilize Zoom each week to communicate content and interact with students re practical work (2 hrs per week)
- Interact with forums on Zoom weekly (1 hr per week)
- Advise and mentor students as needed as they work with their internship or practical work (1 hr per week)
- Grade assignments weekly and submit final grades one week after end of semester (1 hr)

### Qualifications:

- Candidates should possess an earned Doctorate from a regionally accredited University.
- Demonstrated expertise and active involvement in the field among the urban poor. Preference given to those currently residing in majority world urban poor contexts or some years working in the slums or among the poor.
- A commitment and understanding of teaching excellence
- Active scholarship and participation in the field
- A demonstrated, vibrant Christian faith compatible with the mission of William Carey International University.
- Access to high-speed internet required
- Experience in adult education, participatory, action-reflection learning, immersion, project-based learning processes.

**Workload:** 1-3 units per semester. A 3 unit course at 7-10 hours per week is approximately 100-120 hours of work.
